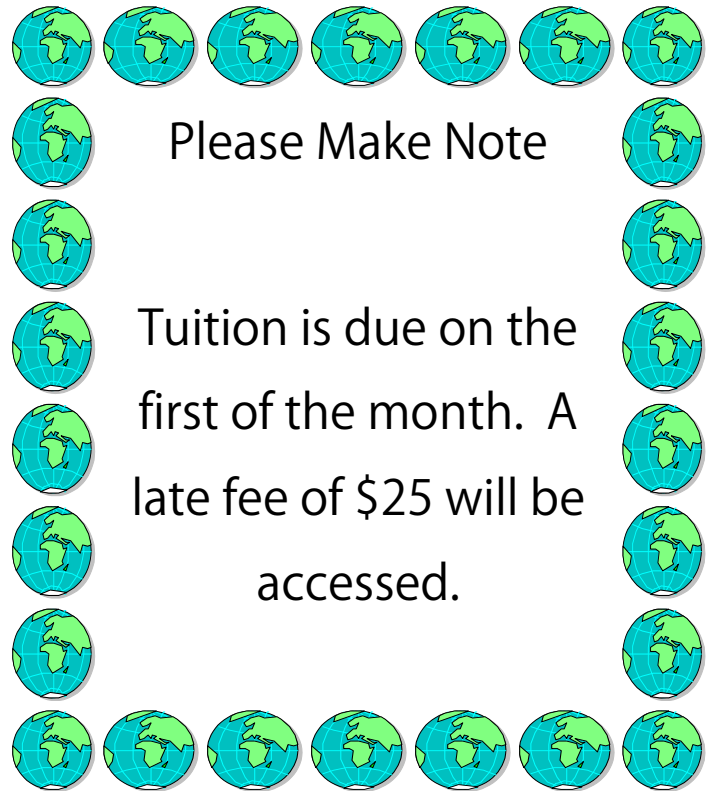

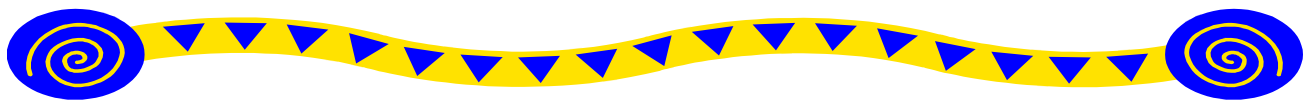

get two. The Pharmacist will divide your prescription into two bottles. This will eliminate the worry of forgetting the medication at school or at home.



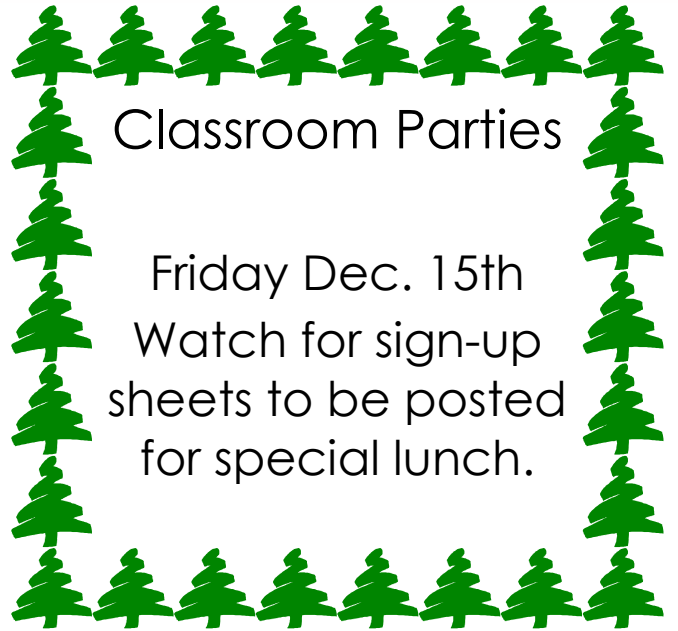

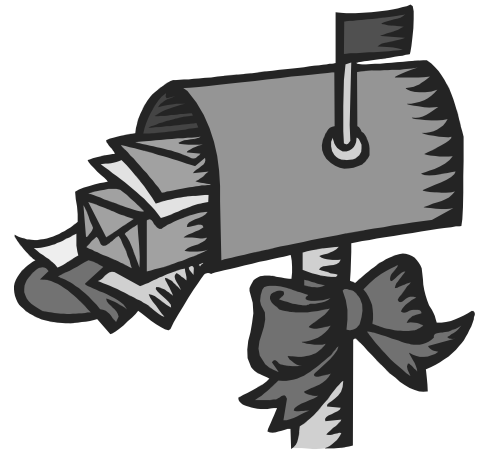

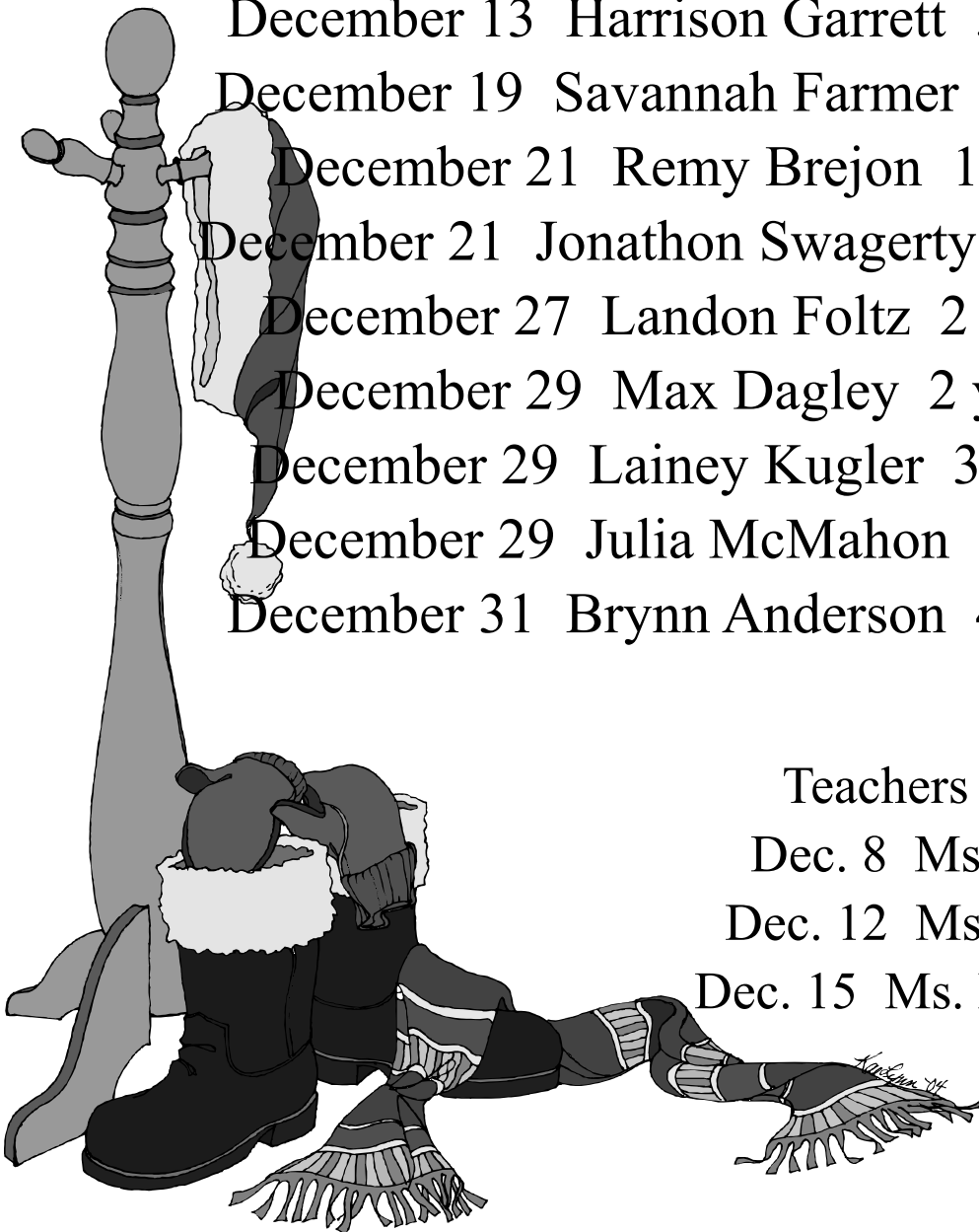
