Images 4 Kids will be here to take **group** pictures for our annual Memory Mates on March 20th and 21st.

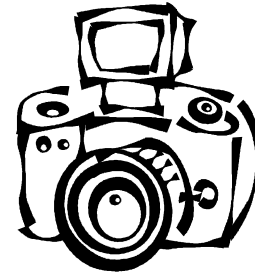
March 20th - Nursery I, Nursery II, Movement I, Movement II, and Toddler I
